

# **EPIPHONE GUITAR DESIGN CONTEST** FOR EAST TENNESSEE STUDENTS

### **Exciting Opportunity For Youth Artists To Customize Guitars With Original Artwork!**

Dogwood Arts, the Songbirds Museum, and Songbirds Foundation are proud to announce the 2021 Epiphone Guitar Design Contest. The contest is open to all high school and middle school students living in East Tennessee. Several guitar designs created by youth artists will be selected for implementation and exhibition. The art guitars will be displayed at the Dogwood Arts Gallery in Knoxville, TN and at the Songbirds Guitar Museum, a one-of-a-kind guitar museum located in Chattanooga, Tennessee. The guitars will be auctioned to benefit Dogwood Arts' youth art programs & the Songbirds Foundation's Guitars for Kids initiative.

#### Winning designers will each receive \$50 for art supplies and additional cash prizes totaling \$1,000 will be awarded to participating artists by the Songbirds Museum!

# HOW TO BE A GUITAR ARTIST

- 1. Students create their own unique guitar art on the guitar template attached to this form (also available online).
- 2. Students give the template and application form back to their art educator (teacher, parent/guardian, etc.).
- 3. Art educators send the guitar designs and completed applications to Dogwood Arts by November 19, 2021.
- 4. Winning designs will be selected by January 3, 2022, and art educators will be notified by email.
- 5. Epiphone guitars will be delivered to art educators in mid-January 2022.
- 6. The Art Guitars need to be completed by March 11, 2022.
- 7. Contest coordinators will manage guitar pick up or drop off with the art educator.
- 8. Guitars will be displayed at the Songbirds Guitar Museum (Chattanooga) during the month of April 2022.
- 9. Guitars will be displayed in Knoxville during the month of May 2022.
- 10. Auction will conclude May 31, 2022.

## CONTEST REQUIREMENTS

- Students must be in Middle or High School.
- Students must live or attend school in the Knoxville or Chattanooga Tennessee region.
- Schools may establish a coordinator for this event, or a single art educator may apply on behalf of a student(s).
- Designs must be made on one of the provided guitar templates, also available at dogwoodarts.com.
- Completed Application Form must be submitted with the guitar design.
- Applications will not be accepted if the form is not signed by the student, parent, and/or educator.
- One guitar will be supplied to each winning designer.
- The design can cover the entire guitar except its pic guard, head, and any Epiphone logos.
- The guitar hardware is not to be altered, and the finished guitar must remain functional.
